In my former book, Theophilus, I wrote about all that Jesus began to do and to teach **Acts 1:1**

For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith—and this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God—⁹ not by works, so that no one can boast. ¹⁰ For we are God's handiwork, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do **Ephesians 2:8-10**

What good is it, my brothers and sisters, if someone claims to have faith but has no deeds? Can such faith save them? ¹⁵ Suppose a brother or a sister is without clothes and daily food. ¹⁶ If one of you says to them, "Go in peace; keep warm and well fed," but does nothing about their physical needs, what good is it? ¹⁷ In the same way, faith by itself, if it is not accompanied by action, is dead. James 2:14-17

All they asked was that we should continue to remember the poor, the very thing I had been eager to do all along. Galatians 2:10

INTRODUCTION

We are called not only to believe and preach the Gospel but to *live it out daily* through our actions—just like Jesus.

The Gospel must be put into action, not just preached.

- 1. Reach back to a time when someone told you what **to do** but did not take the time to show you how to **do it**.
 - What were they asking of you and how did that turn out?
 - When have you needed someone to walk alongside of you and teach you how to do something? Why?
 - When have you reversed the roles and become the teacher/leader?
- 2. Consider these practical ways that you can "Do the Gospel".,
 - We are called to Love Our Neighbor (*Luke 10:25-30*)

- Who in your world is your neighbor and how have you lived out the Gospel in their life in tangible ways?
- Jesus served with Humility (*John 13*)
 - Who have you served in a way that required you to be *less than* the person that you served? How challenging was that for you?
- We are called to build *Genuine Community* (Acts 2:44-45)
 - Describe what genuine community looks like in your everyday activities both at work, home and in your neighborhood. *With whom do you share your resources, provide emotional, physical and spiritual support? How are you each carrying one another's burdens? *If you are not experiencing this sort of community what is standing in the way?
- Jesus Advocated for those in the Margins of Society (*Deut. 27:19; Ps. 41:1; 82:3-4*)
 - When have you stepped into the life of someone who had no voice, and spoken on their behalf? When have you worked to make changes for someone who was powerless?
- We are called to Witness Through Our Actions (*Col. 3:17*)
 - When and to whom have you shown kindness, honesty, and generosity so that your actions were louder than any words that you could have spoken? *What was the outcome?
- 3. Consider who Jesus impacted in extraordinary ways by living out the Gospel rather than preaching a sermon.
 - Consider who He healed particularly on the Sabbath.
 - Consider who He feed and why.
 - Consider who He died for and why.
- 4. Jesus expects us to continue His work—even to do more! (John 14:12)
 - Which of Jesus' actions challenges you the most today?
 - How can you (and your group) genuinely serve the poor, the sick, and the marginalized in your local community?
 - In what ways can you be a part of creating a more genuine and supportive Christian community?
