So I commend the enjoyment of life, because nothing is better for a man under the sun than to eat and drink and be glad. Then joy will accompany him in his work all the days of the life God has given him under the sun.

3. God only gives good gifts.

Or which one of you, if his son asks him for bread, will give him a stone? 10 Or if he asks for a fish, will give him a serpent? 11 If you then, who are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will your Father who is in heaven give good things to those who ask him! - Matthew 7:9–11 (ESV)

A FINAL THOUGHT

Corrie ten Boom, a survivor of a Nazi concentration camp, often spoke about finding freedom even within the confines of such places as Ravensbrück, saying, "Never be afraid to trust an unknown future to a known God." In this life, we always have a choice.

1. We can choose to live weighed down by fear and anxiety, seeing only the fleeting, frustrating "hevel" in the world around us.

2.	Or, we can choose to know God, trusting in who He is and how deeply He loves us – acknowledging the reality of our world, yet embracing the good gifts from Him.
